MUSEOPEN is a 2-year Initiative

Grant of \$938,000 from the Mellon Foundation awarded in June 2016.

Our goal is to ensure that OA (Open Access) monographs are visible, discoverable, and potentially transformative in a highly diversified platform environment.

MUSEOPEN

Project MUSE Site Redesign

- Separating research content from organizational/product information
- Streamlined interface for user content experience, developed with intensive, scholar-focused research
- Useful features such as references and footnotes in line with text
- Additional search facets for book series and thematic journal issues
- Personalization options for users to help manage their research activity
- New administrative portals for libraries and publishers to manage their business relationships with MUSE



Project MUSE Site Redesign: MyMUSE Accounts

With a MyMUSE Account, users may

- Save journal articles, issues, and titles to a personal library
- Save book chapters and books to a personal library
- Search within the items in their library
- Quickly generate citations for items saved to their library
- Set up alerts for favorite journals, publishers, and subjects on MUSE
- Customize the MUSE experience for better accessibility
- Set up alerts for new content on MUSE
- View and save searches on MUSE
- See the history of the content recently viewed on MUSE



Project MUSE Site Redesign: Library Admin Portal

Through the new MUSE administrative portal, libraries may

- Retrieve COUNTER-compliant usage reports
- Download MARC records for their books and journals
- Download KBART files for their books and journals
- Download title lists for their books and journals
- Download MARC/KBART/ title lists for OA content on MUSE
- Update OpenURL and proxy settings, update IP information
- Change how the library name appears on our web site
- Submit changes to admin, financial, and tech contacts
- (Forthcoming) Manage Evidence-Based Acquisition for books

Open Access on MUSE

Open Access Books

- Nearly 600 books from over 20 publishers now available OA
- Made open through mechanisms including collaborative funding programs (Knowledge Unlatched, TOME), grant funding (NEH Humanities Open Book), campus collaborations (i.e. U of Utah Press + Library)

Open Access Journals

- Three titles, through Hosted Journals program for publishers

All OA Content

- *DRM-free*
- *Unlimited usage, downloading, printing*
- *Search/Browse like all MUSE content*
- *MARC/KBART available*
