## Project MUSE Journal Collections

Project MUSE journal collections are available to institutions for subscription access. Libraries may select from among several interdisciplinary collections that are designed to meet specific needs and budgets, or may choose to subscribe to one or both of MUSE's discipline-specific collections.

<b>PREMIUM COLLECTION</b>	<i>MUSE's foremost collection of high quality, interdisciplinary journals and the most comprehensive collection offered. The Premium Collection supports the collection development and research needs of major research institutions and will grow in size annually.</i>
<b>STANDARD COLLECTION</b>	<i>A subset of the Premium Collection that offers institutions the interdisciplinary content consistent with their collection development needs yet ensures controlled annual growth.</i>
<b>BASIC RESEARCH COLLECTION</b>	<i>A more limited subset of the Premium Collection offering a fundamental collection of interdisciplinary journals that grows modestly in size each year making it an appropriate collection for institutions with limited budgets.</i>
<b>BASIC COLLEGE COLLECTION</b>	<i>The smallest interdisciplinary subset of the Premium Collection with modest annual growth and designed for four and two year colleges.</i>
<b>HUMANITIES COLLECTION</b>	<i>A subset of the Premium Collection providing a highly relevant set of research journals for art schools, museums, performing arts organizations, film schools, and related institutions.</i>
<b>SOCIAL SCIENCES COLLECTION</b>	<i>A subset of the Premium Collection designed to meet the needs of special libraries such as think tanks, government agencies, non-governmental organizations, research institutes, and related organizations.</i>

## Single Title Subscriptions

Selected journals are available for single title subscriptions on the MUSE platform. Not all titles available for individual subscription are included in the MUSE Journal Collections; some journals are available only for single title subscription. Libraries may order single title subscriptions directly with MUSE, or through their usual subscription agent.

- Electronic subscriptions operate on a 12-month calendar year term.
- Some journals may be accessed on MUSE but require electronic subscription orders to be placed directly with the publisher. See our website for full details.
- Some journals offer combined electronic and print subscriptions. Print-only subscriptions must be ordered directly from the journal publishers.

## Archival Content

Project MUSE is committed to providing the scholarly community with access to journal content in the humanities and social sciences that is wide ranging in subject matter and extensive in years covered. MUSE continues to supplement current journal content with archival content for many of its journals resulting in a growing list of over 150 journals with their complete run in MUSE. Journals with a complete run in MUSE start with volume 1, issue/number 1 and continue through to the most recent issue.

Libraries with a current subscription to a MUSE journal collection enjoy access to all available archival content for the journals included in their collection, so long as their subscription remains active.

## MUSE Journals and Open Access

Project MUSE now hosts a growing collection of fully open access (OA) journals, offering distinguished scholarly publishers a platform for their OA titles which ensures visibility, discoverability, and wide dissemination.

Some subscription journals on MUSE also choose to make selected articles or issues of their journals OA. MUSE is committed to supporting publishers in their efforts to explore new models for scholarly communications and to support research funder requirements for content to be open.

OA journal content on MUSE is freely available to libraries and users around the world. OA articles may be discovered using the same tools for all MUSE content and will appear in searches alongside articles from an institution's subscribed journals.

- North American academic libraries are divided into pricing tiers based on type of institution as defined by Carnegie Classification.
- Pricing for institutions outside of North America is based on several factors unique to each institution. Overall, pricing is designed to enable MUSE to be accessible to a wide variety of institutions around the world.
- MUSE participates in the INASP program that works to make journal content more widely available to libraries in developing countries.

MUSE also has subscription arrangements with many consortia. If your institution is a member of a consortium, please contact the consortium office for pricing information.
