

# **Project MUSE Institutional Subscriber License Agreement**

## **Book Collection Subscription**

This Institutional Subscriber Licensing Agreement for Project MUSE Book Collections is by and between The Johns Hopkins University Press (“JHUP”), a division of the Johns Hopkins University and the creator, owner, and distributor of Project MUSE®, and \_\_\_\_\_ (“Subscriber”).

### **I. TERM OF AGREEMENT**

The term of this agreement shall begin on 12:00 midnight EST on \_\_\_\_\_, 20\_\_ and expire at 12:00 midnight EST on December 31, 20\_\_. Thereafter, it will be renewed automatically each year subject to the terms herein unless either party gives termination notice in writing to the other by December 1 for the following year.

### **II. RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES**

#### **A. Authorized Users**

A subscription to a Project MUSE Book Collection grants unlimited access to the full text of the ebook titles in the collection for educational, research, and personal use by the faculty, staff, students, alumni, library patrons, and other Authorized Users of the Subscriber's campus/institutional network. Distance learners, alumni, and other off-campus affiliates may access MUSE ebooks if their internet access is through the campus network or via a secure proxy server.

Subscribers are expected to make their best feasible efforts to enable access to ebooks only to faculty, students, staff, alumni, and walk-in library patrons using the campus' physical library facilities. There are no contractual limits on the number of Authorized Users from one campus at any given time.

#### **B. Permitted**

Provided that the copyright header attached to the ebook chapter is retained, Authorized Users at the Subscriber's institution may

1. download and print one copy of each ebook chapter for personal use and archive contents on their own personal computers
2. send one copy of a ebook chapter by email, hard copy, or fax to one person in the Subscriber's campus/institutional network at another location for that individual's personal use
3. distribute a copy of individual ebook chapters in print or electronic form to Authorized Users, including the distribution of a copy for noncommercial educational purposes, to each individual student (Authorized User) in a class at a Subscriber's institution

4. use a persistent URL, or durable URL, to a ebook chapter for courses of instruction offered by the Subscribing Institution, where access is restricted to students enrolled in the course, to instructors, and to library staff maintaining the link, and such access is limited to the duration of the course. Each item should carry an appropriate acknowledgment of the source, copyright, and publisher, and the links to such items shall be deleted by the Subscriber when they are no longer required for such purpose.
5. place selected listings and notices on the campus network to inform users of availability
6. display, download or print chapters from ebooks for the purpose of internal marketing or testing or for training Authorized Users or groups of Authorized Users

### **C. Not Permitted**

Authorized Users at the Subscriber's institution may not

1. disseminate content from Project MUSE outside the campus or institution by any means, except as noted above
2. transmit the digital source code, whether plain ASCII or tagged
3. use contents from Project MUSE in course packs offered for sale
4. utilize MUSE ebooks for the purposes of fulfilling interlibrary loan requests
5. systematically download content by robots or other automatic processes without explicit approval from JHUP
6. burden server(s) with activities, such as computer programs, that automatically download content, commonly known as web robots, spiders, crawlers, wanderers, or accelerators. If there is evidence that such unauthorized activities have taken place, the Subscriber will be contacted, and access to the offending IP address(es) may be blocked if a prompt resolution is not achieved. No refunds or credits will be given for time without access as a result of such activities.
7. remove, cover, overlay, obscure, block, or change any copyright notices, legends, or terms of use; or modify or create a derivative work of any ebook content without the prior written permission of the copyright holder
8. re-use content for commercial use without prior written permission of the copyright holder
9. make agreements for access to MUSE ebook content with individuals, organizations, vendors, affiliates, or partners, who are not Authorized Users.

If the Subscriber becomes aware of unauthorized access to Project MUSE, it will notify JHUP immediately and cooperate in locating and attempting to stop the specific individuals who are abusing the service. If the specific abuser(s) cannot be identified or stopped, JHUP has the right to withhold, suspend, or terminate access to any or all subscribed content, without liability.

## **III. COPYRIGHT AND PERMISSIONS**

Unless otherwise noted, Publishers hold the copyright on all books on Project MUSE, whether

the material is in print or electronic form. All book content is subject to "fair use" provisions of U.S. or applicable international copyright laws [<https://www.copyright.gov/fair-use/more-info.html>]. A list of the Publishers participating in Project MUSE Book Collections can be found on the MUSE web site.

In the event of a dispute between a Publisher and any contributor with respect to the electronic distribution of any MUSE ebook content, JHUP shall have the right to remove such content, and will do so upon the Publisher's request.

Requests for authorization to distribute copies of ebooks for use outside of the provisions listed above should be sent to the Copyright Clearance Center (CCC). In preparing your request, please note the name of the copyright holder of the book and follow the CCC instructions for that copyright holder. No permission requests should be sent to Project MUSE.

#### **IV. ACCESS AND AUTHENTICATION**

The Project MUSE file server permits entry by recognizing the authorized IP addresses. Distance learners and alumni who access the internet via campus IP accounts or a secure proxy server may use Project MUSE, but direct access is not available through independent service providers. Referring URL is also offered as an alternative method for remote access, so long as a secure system is in place, to allow only Authorized Users, as described above, access to Project MUSE via the referring URL. Project MUSE also supports access via Shibboleth authentication.

At the time an order is placed, the Subscriber provides IP addresses for all institutional networks and computers that require access to MUSE ebooks, as well as any relevant details for enabling access via referring URL or Shibboleth. No credit is given for the submission of incorrect or incomplete IP ranges or access details, or for IP information or access details submitted late.

The Subscriber will make reasonable efforts to create and maintain appropriate security measures to ensure that only Authorized Users can access subscribed content online. The Subscriber also affirms that all IP addresses provided for use of MUSE ebooks are controlled by its institution exclusively for internet access by Authorized Users. Valid IP addresses must not include those of publicly accessible proxy or cache servers.

#### **V. USAGE STATISTICS**

JHUP shall provide the Subscriber with COUNTER-compliant usage data on the subscribed ebooks on a monthly basis, for private internal use by JHUP and the Subscriber only.

## **VI. SUBSCRIPTION TERMS**

### **A. Calendar Year Term**

All Project MUSE Book Collection subscriptions on run on a calendar year subscription term. All subscriptions expire on December 31, regardless of start date.

### **B. Subscription Activation**

For access to be enabled, the Subscriber must provide technical and administrative data about its campus or institution via the Project MUSE online order form or other mutually agreed upon method. Upon receipt of a fully completed order form, JHUP will permit the Subscriber access to the MUSE ebook content.

### **C. Invoicing and Payment**

Upon receipt of a confirmed order for a Project MUSE Book Collection subscription, an invoice will be generated. Payment must be received by JHUP within 60 days of receipt of invoice, or access to ebook content will be disabled. Access to ebook content will be re-enabled only upon receipt of full payment of any outstanding invoices, and no credit will be given for periods without access as a result of late payment.

### **D. Renewal**

At renewal time, usually around September 1, the Subscriber will be provided with pricing information for the following year. No later than November 1, JHUP will invoice the Subscriber for renewal. Renewal orders must be paid in full within 60 days of receipt of invoice to ensure the Subscriber's continued access to online content.

### **E. Book Content**

Project MUSE Book Collections offered for subscription access consist of book titles designated by Project MUSE and the participating publishers as permissible for inclusion in subscription products, and MUSE reserves the right to alter the contents of any subscription package on an annual basis. A current list of included books will be made available for download from the MUSE web site at all times.

## **VII. ADDITIONAL TERMS**

If any provision or provisions of this License shall be held to be invalid, illegal, unenforceable, or in conflict with the law of any jurisdiction, the validity, legality, and enforceability of the remaining provisions shall not be in any way affected or impaired thereby.

JHUP will not be held liable for any delays, inaccuracies, errors or omissions in Project MUSE, in the transmission or delivery of all or any part thereof, or for any damages arising from any of the foregoing. JHUP does not represent or endorse the accuracy or reliability of any content.
