All titles are peer-reviewed and there are no embargoes on new content. For more than 25 years, MUSE journals have supported research and instructional needs for a wide variety of academic, special, school, and public libraries.

Project MUSE hosts both current and archival content from several hundred peer-reviewed journals across a large range of subjects within the humanities and social sciences. A wide variety of acquisition options makes it easy to provide access to the ideal mix of titles to meet your institution's needs and budget. Participating publishers select the journals they offer on the MUSE platform and decide, in collaboration with MUSE, through which product models their titles are available.

MUSE offers tiered pricing on our curated Journal Collections, providing value for all sizes and types of libraries. Many titles in the collections are also available for individual institutional subscriptions.

Because the Journal Collections are highly selective and their growth moderated to control price increases, we routinely have interest from more titles than we can sustainably incorporate. We also have interest from titles who would like to benefit from the services and visibility provided by our platform, but not participate in collections. MUSE's journal hosting service allows publishers to offer titles on MUSE outside of our curated collections. These journals are available for single title subscriptions and are fully integrated with the collection journals, and MUSE books, for search and discovery.

Project MUSE Journal Collections

Project MUSE Journal Collections are available to institutions for subscription access. Libraries may select from among our four curated, interdisciplinary collections or may choose to subscribe to one or both of MUSE's discipline-specific collections.

PREMIUM COLLECTION

MUSE's foremost collection of high quality, interdisciplinary journals and the most comprehensive collection offered. The Premium Collection supports the collection development and research needs of major research institutions and grows annually with the addition of selectively chosen journals.

STANDARD COLLECTION

A subset of the Premium Collection that offers institutions the interdisciplinary content consistent with their collection development needs yet ensures controlled annual growth.

BASIC RESEARCH COLLECTION

A more limited subset of the Premium Collection offering a fundamental collection of interdisciplinary journals that grows modestly in size each year making it an appropriate collection for institutions with limited budgets.

BASIC COLLEGE COLLECTION

The smallest interdisciplinary subset of the Premium Collection, with modest annual growth and designed for four and two year colleges.

HUMANITIES COLLECTION

A subset of the Premium Collection providing a highly relevant set of research journals for art schools, museums, performing arts organizations, film schools, and related institutions.

SOCIAL SCIENCES COLLECTION

A subset of the Premium Collection designed to meet the needs of special libraries such as think tanks, government agencies, non-governmental organizations, research institutes, and related organizations.

In select international markets, Project MUSE also makes available smaller, subject-based collections. Additionally, some packages of selected hosted journals may be available, at a modest discount from their individual institutional subscription rates. Affordable Collection Pricing

We are happy to help libraries evaluate which of our affordable, curated collections is most appropriate for you. Our tiered pricing is designed to make MUSE accessible to a wide variety of institutions around the globe.

Pricing for academic libraries in the USA and Canada is determined by Carnegie classification or equivalent. Across the rest of the world, academic pricing is based on World Bank income groups along with other factors unique to each institution. Very cost-effective subscriptions are offered for school, public, and special libraries. MUSE

also supports programs that work to make journal content more widely available to libraries in low income countries.

Archival Content

Project MUSE is committed to providing the scholarly community with access to journal content in the humanities and social sciences that is wide ranging in subject matter and extensive in years covered. We collaborate with participating publishers to make their archives available, with more than 200 journals now offering their complete run (starting with volume 1 - issue/number 1, through the current issue) on the MUSE platform.

Libraries with a current subscription to a MUSE Journal Collection enjoy access to all available archival content for the journals included in their collection, so long as their subscription remains active.

Single Title Subscriptions

Hundreds of journals are available for single title subscriptions on the MUSE platform. Some of these journals are also available in the MUSE collections, while others are available only for single title subscription. Subscriptions may be placed through most major agents, and some titles may be ordered directly with the Johns Hopkins University Press Journals Division, which provides fulfillment services for single titles on the MUSE platform.

Subscribing to individual titles on the MUSE platform, alongside MUSE journal collections and electronic books, provides a seamless user experience and enhances the discovery of relevant, timely content.

Project MUSE now hosts a growing collection of fully open access (OA) journals, offering distinguished scholarly publishers a platform for their OA titles which ensures visibility, discoverability, and wide dissemination.

Some subscription journals on MUSE also choose to make selected articles or issues of their journals OA. MUSE is committed to supporting publishers in their efforts to explore new models for scholarly communications and to support research funder requirements for content to be open.

OA journal content on MUSE is freely available to libraries and users around the world. OA articles may be discovered using the same tools for all MUSE content and will appear in searches alongside articles from an institution's subscribed journals.
